

CODE OF CONDUCT

Biltmore Park Town Square is committed to providing a safe and pleasant experience for our guests. With that in mind, we have a few simple rules that we ask everyone to follow.

The following are required:

- Children under the age of 12 must be accompanied by an adult at all times.
- Appropriate attire and footwear must be worn at all times.
- Directions from security guards and Biltmore Farms personnel must be followed.

The following activities are prohibited:

- 1. Violations of the law
- 2. Loitering
- 3. Intoxication
- 4. Possession of firearms or weapons
- 5. Violence or threats to the safety of others
- 6. Public urination or lewd behavior
- 7. Swearing, disturbing the peace, or violation of noise ordinances
- 8. Horseplay or disorderly conduct
- 9. Littering, graffiti, or destruction of property
- 10. Throwing objects from or climbing upon buildings
- 11. Operation of unauthorized recreational vehicles or devices with wheels
- 12. Parking in non-designated areas, overnight, or camping
- 13. Impairing pedestrian or vehicular movements

- 14. Unleashed or unattended pets
- 15. Open alcohol containers or consumption outside of designated areas
- 16. Expressive or performance activity not sponsored by property management
- 17. Unauthorized solicitation, sale of products or services, events, or distribution of advertising
- 18. Photography, drone use, or taking video without written consent from Property Management
- 19. Picketing, distributions of handbills, soliciting, protesting, and petitioning
- 20. Any activity inconsistent with the general purpose of the property, which is shopping, dining, visiting theaters, or offices for business purposes

This property is privately owned. Security cameras may be in use and may be monitored. This list is not exhaustive, and we maintain, at our sole discretion, the right to deny anyone entry for inappropriate actions. We reserve the right to amend and modify rules and policies at any time. Guests who do not act responsibly may be asked to leave. If they refuse to leave the property, they may be arrested and prosecuted for criminal trespass.
